

## ***Alberta and Canada-Alberta Service Centres***

Alberta Service Centres are places where Albertans can get employment, career and training information and assistance. The services available at each office will vary with community size and needs. Some centres are staffed full-time and others part-time.

### **Alberta Service Centres provide free services and information about:**

- Career and employment assistance including help with résumé writing, job search, labour market information and career planning
- Employment and training programs and services
- Alberta Works Income Support program
- Child support services
- Alberta Job Corps
- Disability related employment supports
- Adult and child health benefits
- Employment, career and training publications for job seekers, immigrants and employers

There are 59 service locations throughout the province.

### **Canada-Alberta Service Centres provide all the services and information mentioned above, as well as a variety of federal services and information about:**

- Employment Insurance program
- Passports
- Canada Job Bank

- Federal programs and benefits for families and children, people with disabilities, seniors, workers, youth and students.

There are 12 Canada-Alberta Service Centres in the province.

Some service centres have Labour Market Information Centres (LMICs) which are multi-media resource centres with an extensive range of career and employment-related print and electronic resources and information to help make career, learning and work decisions.
